Very Special Trip to Zimbabwe

We were invited to teach in Zimbabwe at the Mbizo Church in Kwekwe, Zimbabwe. About thirty years ago, Donald and Margaret Mossman left their estate to the Grape Grove Church in Ohio. The Church then gave \$5,000 to help the Mbizo Church complete their roof and floor on their new building. This body of believers is strong and growing. They have also started several other sister churches in the surrounding area.

Jaynie remembers when the funds were given to help this church, never even dreaming that she would one day be visiting and teaching in this very building. Jacob preached and Jaynie was asked to teach about the value of Moringa.

Our guests from Zimbabwe, who visited us in March, reported that Mrs. Chinyoka doesn't have a problem with her white blood cells and her husband doesn't have prostate cancer after taking Moringa.

Truly the Church in Zimbabwe is maturing and carrying out the Lord's Great Commission of reaching the lost.

Marriage for Dionisio and Maria

Approximately a month after Dionisio was divorced; the local Chief told us that Dionisio must take another wife! He wasn't permitted to work or preach in this area without a wife, due to cultural customs.

Dionisio informed the church, they insisted on arranging a wife for him. A younger sister of one of the women in our church family was selected. Jacob and Jaynie, the church family, and the future wife's family approved of the choice, after much prayer, interviews conducted by the church leaders and church family, and medical exams. Maria, a 25 year old widow with a six month old daughter named Regetta, agreed to the pre-arranged marriage. May13, 2013 was the big day. Jaynie helped with wedding preparations, baked a cake, and supplied the bride with a gown.

Maria's mother was able to travel from Chimoio to attend the ceremony,

but her father wasn't able to come. A member of the church family presided *Dionisio & Maria Bulão* over the ceremony, Jaynie shared about the importance of placing God as the head of the marriage and Jacob gave a blessing and prayers. She has been welcomed and embraced by the community. She is helping Jaynie with the children's classes on Sunday mornings.



The Middle of Our Winter

Yes, it is winter in Mozambique. No icy roads and snow, but still, it is winter. The days are partly sunny, partly cloudy with a rare rain shower. The nights are chilly, at least to us, with temps in the lower 50's and feels cooler when the wind blows across the open grass lands.

"Coins for Coverings"

Those living in our area, Mombedzi Um (one), suffer from the cold weather much more than we do! They don't have wind/cold proof shelter with windows and doors that they can close or comfy beds. Jaynie prayed for a solution to this problem when a couple of ladies from our church body were talking about this issue, thus "Coins for Coverings" was birthed. Jaynie's prayer was to have enough to satisfy the needs of our local church family, and to give praise and glory to our Heavenly Father.

We wrote to you, our supporting churches and individuals, to ask if you could help with this project. The response was amazingly generous and extremely quick! In record time, we received enough to purchase \$3,150 worth of blankets. The outpouring of your love was beyond anything that Jaynie had prayed to achieve. We definitely had enough to "cover" Mombedzi Um, not only with blankets, coats, and hoodies, but with the love of God demonstrated

through His wonderful children. Thank you so much for your selfless donations. We purchased bundles of used blankets that weigh about 90 lbs. each. We distributed hoodies, adult winter coats, children's winter coats, and blankets to our local church fellowship and then to eight other churches in the area. We provided

blankets for the local government officials, police department, area clinic, and another clinic farther north, as well as six areas with orphans. We asked the Chief to provide a list of families in our area under his jurisdiction, which consisted of 156 names. We thought we would have enough to distribute blankets according to family size, but the chief said only one blanket per family so we wouldn't create confusion. Our chief, the local secretary, two other chiefs, and three local police were present during distribution for crowd control. We praise God for their help, the chief's insight, and our local policemen. The list was grossly under estimated. We had over 380 families in our area! Crowd control was needed and distribution stopped for a short period of time until a more complete list was being compiled. Night was upon us and the chief called for cessation, but a few had not received blankets. I

asked for mercies to be given and the remaining 6 received their blankets before leaving for the night. We were instructed to not distribute any more blankets without an approved list from the chief. We were swamped with people at our gate several days later, but we sent them to the chief. He controlled the list of recipients and transported blankets from here to there in the cover of the night. It was quite the ordeal, but we are so pleased to have been God's servants and you, our brothers and sisters in Christ, made it possible.

Your gifts purchased 828 double blankets, 240 single blankets, 11 baby blankets, 50 adult winter jackets, 43 small children winter jackets and 139 hooded shirts, and a host of unexpected "goodies" in the bundles of blankets! That means that we have been able to cover, more than 2,000 men,

women, and children. Praise to God Almighty! That number is probably higher, but we can't be exact. For example, one double blanket may cover three or four children of one family. Some infants may sleep with their parents. They stay warmer that way. We're also not able to clarify how many individuals we have helped. Three families have a total of 36 members, just parents and children. Another family had 20 children. Only God knows specifically how many have been "covered" by and through His love, regardless, it is a huge blessing. What a wonderful way to show God's love and evangelize Mombedzi Um. Many here thank God for you!

Our Visit to Cuamba and Lichinga

It has been a number of years since we last visited the churches in Cuamba and Lichinga. On June13th, we left for Gurué. It was a 12 hour trip. Dionisio went with us to visit stay overnight with his family in Gurué. We stayed at the Catholic Mission. We left early the following morning for Cuamba and arrived in the afternoon. We travelled to a rural area, tented overnight and held an all-day seminar the next day. Twenty Churches were represented and were greatly blessed. Saturday night we stayed at the SIM guesthouse.

We left for Lichinga the following morning and stayed with Steve and Julie Henderson, Good News For Africa colleagues, who live just outside of Lichinga. We introduced them to the three churches

in Lichinga, all of which, speak the Lomwe

language. The majority of people in Lichinga speak Yao. Steve and Julie have a tremendous job ahead of them to try and mobilize the churches to evangelize their neighbors who speak a different language.

Because of that, we were able to save one of our trusted workers from going to prison and perhaps ultimately dying. He didn't know that having a military explosive in your possession was against the law. He was arrested and within hours of being sent to prison, Dionisio intervened on his behalf and beg for mercy. He was issued a steep fine which he wouldn't be able to pay. Jacob and Jaynie were able to pay the fine and Manuel will work off the debt. We praise God for his provision. Manuel has 7 children and a wife. It's told that *Dionisio baptizing a new* he would be fed cement and then placed in prison to work relentlessly long days, and eventually die a painful death.
