What Jaynie learned at ECHO in Florida!

In January we left cold Ohio for the sunny State of Florida. Jacob's brother and sister-in-love, Phyllis hosted us for three weeks. They even drove us to Fort Myers where the Echo Farm is located. The welcome



was very friendly and we toured the property. Much needed research in agriculture and third world technology is taking place here, including a seed bank.

Jaynie spent a week at Echo and was housed by Ellen and Bob Hargrave, the resident missionary family. Surprise! They were friends of our neighbors in Mozambique, Paul and Mary Ann Slayton.

Jaynie spent every possible moment gleaning information from Echo's wonderful library, knowledgeable staff, and practical experience. Echo also presented me with valuable books which will be very useful in my new ministry, using tropical plants as medicine.

Time ran short, but I am much better educated and equipped.

Our Farm in Africa!

We submitted our proposal about using tropical plants as medicine to the Mozambique government. Our evangelist and friend, Dionisio Bulão, has labored diligently to secure a suitable place for us to live and property to develop. The government has embraced our plans and has given us a 440 acre farm

about 14 miles north of the city of Chimoio. We praise the Lord for answered prayers and His wonderful provision! We have not seen this property in person or in print, but have been told that we have a river for water, but no electricity. Work, work, and work awaits us! Our first project is to build our cob home, which is a medium consisting of sand, clay and straw. This is more economical and currently, cement is costly in Mozambique.

These are our two main reasons for us owning a farm:

- 1. We want to bring honor and glory to our Heavenly Father by assisting with the spiritual and physical needs of our Mozambican family while creating dependency on the Lord.
- 2. We want to use methods and technology which can be duplicated and sustained in the Mozambican culture, which will also provide income through cottage industries and improve quality of life and longevity. Educating them to utilize the resources that they have, for example, traction animals, making carts, raising plants for medicines, purifying water, soap making, preserving food with basic solar ovens, providing land for our cattle project and also cash crops.
- Jacob will continue with his ministry of training national leaders, as well as, providing and printing teaching material. He will help Jaynie as much as he can with the operation of the farm.
- New Co-workers, Al and Velma Corson, are preparing to leave for Portugal in August and Lord willing, arrive in Mozambique in January of 2009. (pictured on the right)
